The October 11th bulletin cover showed the cross which hangs in our chancel area, designed by Hugh Logan who was the leading artistic force behind the 1953 church sanctuary's renovation reflecting the appearance of the early 19th century.

The October 4th bulletin cover was the drawing of the church interior for this week's bulletin was done by Hugh Logan showing the new 1953 church interior. Hugh was the mastermind in the design of the church sanctuary.

The September 27th bulletin cover is from a c.1960 note card. The artist's name cannot be deciphered and therefore the 275th Anniversary Committee would welcome any information.

PLEASE KEEP SKEET'S SHELVES FULL!! We need everybody's help to re-stock our Skeet's Pantry so that the growing number of people and families in need can be fed each month through our Cranbury Presbyterian food program. The numbers are growing due to economic problems, loss of jobs, and even family violence causing moms and children to have to move and fend for themselves for safety's sake. All kinds of difficulties are facts of life for folks right here in Cranbury and surrounding communities, and they are so grateful for our help to put food on their tables.

So PLEASE help to keep our shelves full so that we can continue to care for these folks in need. Just put your donations in the wheelbarrow outside church on Sunday or leave bags labeled "Skeet's Pantry" in the little telephone/mailbox room across from Fellowship Hall. The following items are needed: Soups, peanut butter, tuna fish, macaroni and cheese, beans/pork and beans, canned fruit and vegetables. Other foods are welcome, too, just please check the expiration dates on them. Toothpaste, tooth brushes, soap, and laundry detergent would also be very helpful.

A SNIPPET FROM THE YEAR BOOK OF PRAYER: As has been pointed out previously in our Annual reports and newsletters, the Presbyterian Church is a connectional church. This factor is surely born out in the Presbytery of Southern New England. The pastor of a new church development in that presbytery drives the church van every Monday and Friday to a detention center to visit Brazilian immigrants. He leads Bible studies, and gives pastoral care to detainees who may speak only Portuguese. But he needs assistance to make this ministry possible. His Fall River, Massachusetts congregation grants him the time to be away two days a week. The presbytery pays for some of the expenses. The Outreach Foundation as given dozens of Portuguese Bibles for distribution. The General Assembly's Immigrant Group Ministries office, helped to purchase the van used by the pastor. So it is obvious that this valuable service could not continue without much outside help. And it is heartening to note that several detainees have found faith in Jesus through this ministry.
