A SNIPPET FROM THE BOOK OF PRAYER: Here is a surprising story about a Baptist Church in Smolensk, Russia, southwest of Moscow. The Outreach Foundation to which we contribute has connected PC(USA) churches with this congregation. The church works with at least sixteen orphanages across the region. Church teams visit weekly to lead singing and Bible lessons, put on mini-Olympiads, support renovations at the most broken-down orphanages, host holiday parties, and make regular visits to the government-run summer camps for orphans. The Smolensk Church, with support from a U.S. Presbyterian partner, is working to develop a program for post-orphanage care. Let's remember them in our prayers.
