A SNIPPET FROM THE YEAR BOOK OF PRAYER: Sometimes, it seems a church can set out to attract people and, when they come, the church is not certain how to deal with them! Such a situation existed in Grace Presbytery, Texas, in the First Presbyterian Church of Temple. After determining to stay in its changing downtown area and develop spaces surrounding the building, including a single basketball goal, neighborhood youth came at all hours to shoot hoops. Finally one young man accepted an invitation to come inside, eventually bringing his brothers and sisters to the church Vacation Bible School. Soon other children followed for after-school programs and Sunday School. But these children did not grow up in the church, and the church has had to change to meet their needs. "Build it and they will come" is not enough; for after they come is the complicated process of learning names and building relationships, of learning how to respond to the little girl who, seeing a picture of Jesus, asked "Does he work here?" (Well, yes he does, but not as you might easily explain.)

CONTRIBUTING TO HAITI - The PC(USA) including the Cranbury Church is deeply concerned about Haiti and the disaster that is making life so difficult for its people. Immediately after the earthquake, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) sent \$100,000 from One Great Hour of Sharing. Prayers have, I'm sure, been constant on the part of both clergy and lay people. Our church is doing what it can. Last Sunday, our "retiring offering" garnered \$1,933.00 Session

voted at its January 19 meeting to send \$2,000 to PDA and \$3,000 to Good Shepherd Hospital, a Haitian hospital, which we have been helping to support for many years. These grants will come from our Endowment Fund Interest.

Today we shall be holding another "retiring offering" to which you may contribute cash or checks made out to our church which will then be sent on to PDA.
