**A SNIPPET FROM THE YEAR BOOK OF PRAYER:** Thanks to grants from the Presbytery of Mackinac, the Presbytery churches have been able to devise unique and needed ways to serve their varied populations. For instance, The Church of the Straits in Mackinaw City has been serving an aging population that is challenged by the often brutal weather. To enable those persons to remain linked to the church, the church developed a website that allows those who cannot attend worship to hear the sermon online. In addition, a CD copier was purchased so a deacon can take copies of the worship service to the nearby assisted living center. A phone tree system was established to inform members of pastoral and program activities. And another congregation served young families who had limited resources and used a bus to reach agencies that offered assistance. But often the bus tokens were beyond the means of these families. So now, free tokens are distributed each week at the bus stop at the church parking lot.
