A SNIPPET FROM THE YEAR BOOK OF PRAYER: Members of the Ogalala Sioux tribe living in Wanblee, S.D. on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation are among the poorest people in the nation. They are people for whom the Presbyterian Church in Platte, S.D. have a heart. The other churches in Platte--7 of them in a town of about 1,350--join the Presbyterians in helping these Wanblee residents. Every month a group of volunteers from Platte goes to Wanblee. They bring firewood, blankets, and food, but, they bring more than material goods for while they are there they chat with these fellow South Dakotans and even perform small services such as cutting hair or painting nails. They have constructed a building addition, distributed clothing and toys, and often the visitors and the hosts worship together. They become acquainted with one another's different cultures and become friends, showing Christ's love, carrying the message that "God loves you."

Visitors! We hope that you will find a warm welcome here. We invite you to consider membership in our church family. Please speak to one of the greeters or pastors after worship for more information.
