A SNIPPET FROM THE YEAR BOOK OF PRAYER: The Christian Mission Hospital (CMH) in Rajshahi, Bangladesh attracts patients weakened by disease, hunger and thirst. They could go to a government hospital just two miles away and pay less, but they hunger for the touch of God and know God is present there at CMH. In addition to the medical attention from the doctors and nurses, sixty students from the Elizabeth Conan Memorial Nursing School spend time with the patients. The spiritual training and worship services in which they participate morning and evening encourage these students to move beyond dispensing medicine and become medicine themselves. They come to realize how much their gentle touch, their kind words, and the receptivity of their hearts to each individual patient mean. These nurses are being transformed by Christ into balms of healing and upon graduation will go throughout their country to minister in his name.
