**Update - Concrete Replacement in Front of Sanctuary**

We have contracted to have the concrete work removed in front of the Sanctuary. We will replace it with new concrete that will provide for handicap access to all of the three entrances. From a landing area in front of the doors the concrete will slope out to the front sidewalk on Main Street as well as the sidewalk to the courtyard and the driveway on the south side of the sanctuary. The gradual slope will not require hand railings.

The committee feels that this will be a big improvement to the entrance to the building and will eliminate the need for the temporary ramp every time the building is used. Anyone with any questions can contact either John Kirkenir or George Conley IV.

**The work will commence after church on July 11** and is expected to be completed (weather permitting) by **Sunday, July 18**. Access to the Sanctuary will be provided during construction but will be of a temporary nature.
