A SNIPPET FROM THE YEAR BOOK OF PRAYER: You may be surprised to learn that a New Jersey Indian Church was organized in 1995. It is now situated nearby in the Community Presbyterian Church of the Sand Hills in the Presbytery of New Brunswick. New Brunswick Presbytery had produced a procedure to guide faith communities through the process of becoming new church developments and chartered congregations. The New Jersey Indian Church became the first to enter into formal relationship with the presbytery under these guidelines. The pastor was received into the presbytery with a validated ministry as organizing pastor and evangelist. The congregation is vigorous, though small, but 80 percent of its members are families with children. The presbytery has provided help with worship leadership and other pastoral ministries so the pastor can give more of his time to evangelism.
