A SNIPPET FROM THE YEAR BOOK OF PRAYER: The Presbytery of Redstone in Pennsylvania has decided it does not wish to be known as God's "frozen chosen" but instead to seek out new friendships and transform itself into God's preferred and promised future as a missional presbytery. One church identified needs in its community and opened its parking lot to house a farmers' market in the summer of 2009. Not only did it provide basic, fresh foodstuffs for their neighbors, but, far more important, it brought neighbors together, planting and growing friendships and expanding community. Another church led a variety of activities for children and their

parents in the small towns of its rural neighborhood. They are listening for God's Word in unexpected places.

GUATEMALA DINNER: First and foremost, I would like to thank everyone who contributed their time and talents to make this year's dinners one of the most profitable events. We served over 200 meals between staff and guests. We would like to thank everyone who came to dine and enjoy the fellowship and entertainment. As some of you noted on your questionnaire during dessert, we will be making very minor changes to next year's menu. Over 95% of the people felt that the food and entertainment is just fine the way it is.

The money we raised this year will be taken with the team to Guatemala, leaving on June 25 until July 2. We will be using the money for medical supplies, dental supplies and construction materials. We will start collecting shoes in April and toothbrushes, toothpaste and toiletries in May.
