SNIPPETS FROM THE YEAR BOOK OF PRAYER:

"Bateys" are small communities in the Dominican Republic where a major problem is a lack of

sanitary water. And here is where YOU join the picture for Self-Development of People (SDOP), a ministry of One Great Hour of Sharing Offering, to which you have contributed for many years, enters into partnerships with groups of economically poor people. They may be poor, but they have a vision about how to solve a problem in their community and to make them a total part of the projects funding must be controlled by the immediate beneficiaries. In the last several years, SDOP has partnered with several groups, including batey residents to construct water systems. These residents have been taught how to maintain these systems, so that the systems have become a permanent solution. More than seven thousand people in five bateys now have access to clean water! What a good feeling to know that gifts from our church and many others have contributed to exciting, badly needed projects such as these.

BREAD FOR THE WORLD OFFERING OF LETTERS (JUNE 5) – Yes, today is the day you have been hearing about--the day that you are urged to participate in the annual BREAD FOR THE WORLD Offering of letters. Gather at the BFW table in Fellowship Hall this morning; sign the letters which urge our Senators and Representatives to make some important changes in the Foreign Assistance Act which has not been updated since 1961! We'll be looking for YOU!

GUATEMALA MISSION: Our mission trip to Guatemala is quickly approaching. We will be going June 25 through July 2. We are collecting shoes (slightly used or new) and socks (new), dental supplies and medicines.

Medicines: Prenatal vitamins; children's vitamins; Acetaminophen; ibuprofen

Needed Dental care supplies: Soft toothbrushes; Toothpaste (Screw top only); Dental floss

Shoes: New or slightly used, no open toes

Combs and Brushes: New only

Please put donated supplies in any of the various buckets labeled Guatemala or place on the stage in Fellowship Hall.
