**SNIPPETS FROM THE YEAR BOOK OF PRAYER:** Singapore, one of the smallest nations of the world, has just fewer than 5 million people. But the PC(USA) is involved with this small country through its relationship with the Presbyterian Church and Trinity Theological College, an ecumenical seminary. Singapore is an ideal place for this seminary because it is at a geographic crossroads. The Seminary trains missionaries and church workers for much of Asia, and its student population represents a wide variety of churches, including those related to Evangelical, Charismatic, Pentecostal, and Roman Catholic traditions, although it is governed by four mainline denominations.
