Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer: We missed World Food Day but it is never too late to quote David Beckmann, president of Bread for the World, when he describes "our time as one in which we are called by God to be involved in a great liberation on an exodus from hunger". Strides have been made in this exodus with those who are still suffering from hunger's grip. We are all aware of the financial crisis from which we and the entire world are facing. But we do not seem always to grasp the food crisis under which we live. In the past few years rice, wheat, corn, and other basic food stuffs have doubled or tripled in price, a trend that is uncomfortable for us, but devastating to people living in poor countries where food accounts for more than half a family's spending. Food-supplying countries have been limiting exports in an attempt to protect domestic consumers, leading to angry protests from farmers and making things even worse in countries that need to import food. We have read the Bible stories that relate how Jesus fed the 5,000 and the 4,000, and we are still called to feed the hungry.
