People: Peace that is not merely the absence of war and conflict, but peace that is the fullness of blessing for all - that is the peace for which we dare to hope.

Leader: *Christ comes to bring peace to those who have been separated from God and one another.*

People: In the name of that Child born so long ago, we light the candles of peace and hope.

Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer: Although ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING is an Easter offering, and, hence a good many months from now, it is good to know that the gifts that we have given in the past have been put, and continue to be put, to good use. We are all aware of the terrible disaster that struck Haiti, and the continuing problems that island suffers. Immediately after the hurricane, One Great Hour of Sharing and general designated funds were sent to provide temporary shelter, food, and health assistance. More funds provided water and sanitation engineers and equipment to construct water purification systems. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance will continue its support in the struggle to rebuild from Haiti's worst earthquake in 200 years. How wonderful that our church is still at work in Haiti.

Thinking of tax efficient ways for year-end giving? Consider the following:

1. Transfer securities, in-kind, to the Church and avoid paying a capital gains tax that could arise from liquidating securities. Suitable for individual stocks, bonds or shares of mutual funds;
2. Consider directing any of your IRA distributions directly to the Church and avoid including the amount of the distribution as taxable income.
