Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer: The Presbytery of Winnebago in Wisconsin and Uraba Presbytery in Colombia have shared a partnership for the past 10 years. Through a retreat in the countryside of Medellin, leaders from both presbyteries have been able to study, worship, play and envision a better future together. Their partnership is not one of "us and them" but rather of "we and our". They have visited one another, prayed for one another, and shared the ways that they find God moving in their lives.

Bread for the World Offering of Letters -- FEBRUARY 12, 2012:

Are you aware that foreign aid, which includes emergency food aid, accounts for less than 1 percent of the US national budget? This fact, a surprise too many of us, is certainly proof that cutting foreign aid does little or nothing to balance at the budget. In fact, said Derrick Boykin, associate for African American Leadership Outreach at Bread for the World, "It will cost us more in the long run undermining the progress already made in reducing maternal and child deaths and severe malnutrition--especially in the Horn of Africa."

Consequently, included in the Circle of Protection being urged in the Offering of Letters we shall be advocating for stronger US government focus on reducing poverty, clearer accountability of how aid dollars are spent, a transformed US development agency and (to me, this qualification if perhaps the most urgent)

providing aid that meets the needs and wants of local people. The transformation will mean more help to millions of hungry and poor people for years to come. We need to advocate for this kind of assistance and protest cuts in what our government gives to foreign aid.
