Minister: The Lord be with you.

Minister: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them up to the Lord.

Minister: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise. [The Minister continues.]

God is praised for the history of faithfulness shown to God's people. The congregation then joins the celestial choirs and all the faithful of every time and place to sing:

Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer: Criminal justice is not something we think about a great deal. But in 2008, member communions of the National Council of Churches including the PC(USA) adopted the following Social Creed: "In faith responding to our Creator, we celebrate the full humanity of each woman, man, and child all created in the divine image as individuals of infinite worth, by working for: A system of criminal rehabilitation based on restorative justice and an end to the death penalty". This Creed reflects our understanding of the enduring possibility of repentance that is part of our Christian faith. It considers the humanity of victim and perpetrator and calls for restoration through "coming clean about the full cost of a crime." It offers hope for transformation through things like community service, fines, and arenas for public repentance, restitution and forgiveness.

Bread for the World Offering of Letters -- FEBRUARY 12, 2012:

As the day for our Offering of Letters draws closer, we want to emphasize the thrust of the letters we shall be sending to our Senators and Representatives. A Circle of Protection is the theme, and we are urging that budget cuts that the Congress is and will be making should not focus on vital programs that serve people in need. An estimated 46 million people live in poverty in the United States, many of whom depend on programs such as SNAP (formerly food stamps) and Medicaid to survive. Another program that has been infinitely helpful to low salary workers is the EITC, the Earned Income Tax Credit. And still another is the Child Tax Credit. The EITC is beneficial not only to the recipients but to the economy in general because for the most part this extra badly needed money goes at once for necessary items in the family.

February 12, you will find at the BREAD FOR THE WORLD table in the Fellowship Hall letters to our Senators and Representatives, Rush Holt and Chris Smith, urging them to keep this Circle of Protection not only around the hungry in the U.S., but the hungry in other countries, as well as recommendations on farming issues that need updating and changing. Please join us after church so that you, too, can participate in obeying Jesus' mandate to "feed the hungry".
