Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer: Congregations in Eastern Oklahoma Presbytery are actively serving their communities through creative ministries addressing hunger, poverty and health. Community meals are the focus of several congregations with 3 congregations providing over 100 meals each week. One church has partnered with Lutheran and Disciples of Christ congregations for their community meals. Sewing ministries provide clothing for children and lap quilts and bibs for older adults. Backpack ministries provide either weekend meals for needy families or school supplies. The mission committee of the presbytery provides resources to congregations for hunger, peacemaking, environmental, racial ethnic, and prison ministries.

Bread for the World Offering of Letters -- FEBRUARY 12, 2012: Many thanks to all those who graciously and efficiently helped out at the BREAD FOR THE WORLD table when we were sending out letters to our Senators and Representatives, asking that they adhere to the Circle of Protection--protecting measures that assist the poverty stricken and the hungry. We are sending out a total of 111 letters to Senators Lautenberg and Menendez and Representatives Holt and Smith. We trust that our efforts will make a difference in the votes cast by these men.

Looking Ahead - Trenton Psychiatric Hospital Outreach: May is Mental Illness Awareness Month. In recognition of the needs of those who are affected by mental illness and receiving treatment in Trenton Psychiatric Hospital (TPH), we are asking for donations to be placed in the box in Fellowship Hall for the Trenton Psychiatric Hospital Auxiliary to distribute for birthday gifts and prizes for Bingo, etc. The items they could use are: grooming and cosmetic supplies, playing cards, jewelry, and greeting cards as well as, books, current magazines, DVD movies or TV programs.
