Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer: The First Presbyterian Church in Gainesville, Texas, for the last six years has skipped church one Sunday in September. Members come dressed not for church, but to be the church. On Faith in Action Sunday, the 127-member church disperses throughout the town to work on four ministry projects. Opportunities are there for all ages and skill levels. Throughout these years, they have built a wheelchair ramp for a small flood-damaged church, served brunch at the community college dorms, offered a drive-through brunch in front of the church, landscaped the animal shelter, and served coffee to folks passing through Gainesville on the Amtrak train. And if you came to church, not knowing the plan, there was always one project at the church to be done!

Another objective of **One Great Hour of Sharing** is to aid the self-development of people. Plaquemines Parish is at Louisiana's southernmost tip. It's where the Mississippi River meets the Gulf of Mexico and it is home to the United Fisheries Cooperative. It is estimated that the fishermen in Plaquemines Parish lost 90% of their fleet after the devastating winds and floods that followed hurricanes Katrina and Rita. Already faced with high poverty and illiteracy, this group of lifelong shrimpers, crabbers, and fishermen may have been down, but they are not out. They are determined to rebuild their lives, their livelihood and their community.

In partnership with the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)'s Self-Development of People program, which seeks to assist in the empowerment of economically oppressed and poor people, the South Plaquemines United Fisheries Cooperative created a business that provides economic development opportunities to address poverty in their industry, to rebuild the local fishing industry and to restore their communities and way of life.

Funding from One Great Hour of Sharing provided a grant that helped these fishermen. You should be aware that in some ways this is somewhat similar to what our own MS&G committee and Session have been doing in the Congo. If you've had a chance to visit the website www.IMCK.org, you can see where our church has been trying to help the people of the Kasai to help themselves through medical care and self-help projects
