Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer: When you contributed to One Great Hour of Sharing at Easter, you were enabling The Self-Development of People (SDOP) to make grants to groups that need what is often just a little bit of assistance to get a small, but important, project off the ground. Between songs the women promote the nutritional benefits and principles of environmentally friendly farming and issues of fair trade. So far, profits have been small, but these women know that identifying areas of inequality between men and women is the first step to transforming unjust structures of subordination and profiting from the work of women.
