Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer: The Presbytery of Muskingum Valley in Ohio has been hard hit by the recession and jobs have been scarce. Presbyterians took this sad fact to heart and determined to eliminate unemployment by 2020. As a result Resurrection Houses are sprouting up across the presbytery, their mission being to provide healing through formational prayer and a future through job coaching. The promise: "God goes to work and so will you." The focus has been on the "4Cs" of spiritual formation: Core Identity in Christ, Character transformation through engagement with holy habits, discernment of Call that honors gifts and passions as they intersect with the needs of community, and the development of Competencies in response to God's call. The guiding scripture of the Presbytery in this venture is: "the release of the captives, recovery of sight to the blind and freedom for those oppressed."

HISTORY OF THE MISSION OF THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (USA) - What exciting and satisfying news: to be celebrating the 175th anniversary of international mission by the General Assembly of our Presbyterian Church, a mission that was started in 1837! Our mission heritage is rooted ultimately in Christ's Great Commission to make disciples of all nations and his Great Commandment to love God and neighbor. Presbyterians have answered that Commission and that Commandment by being faithful witnesses to the gospel around the world in urban centers, and small rural villages. Today, total personnel engaged in World Mission number almost 100, serving in approximately 50 countries. And what have they done, there missionaries that have traveled the world, carrying the good news of Christ's grace? They have planted churches, built hospitals, and started schools. The seeds they have planted have in many places developed into robust and self-sustaining churches and institutions now led by local Christian leaders. But these leaders now invite us to send mission personnel to work with them in partnership. And this we do as we help them meet crucial needs that the partner churches cannot meet due to lack of resources and/or trained personnel.

World Mission chiefly does three things: 1. Sends mission personnel. 2. Empowers the global church. 3. Equips the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) for mission. And in these efforts our church works in partnership with local leaders towards tackling critical global issues such as lifting people out of desperate poverty, reaching more people with Christ's message of love, and facilitating reconciliation in some of the world's most troubled places.

Yes, we have a good and proud heritage, but there is more to be done, and our church, as a church and individually, can be part of this mission—serving God and helping people experience an abundant life, both now and eternity. Gretchen Stults taken from *Mission Crossroads*.

Martin Tel, Princeton Theological Seminary's C.F. Seabrook Director of Music, and editor of the newly released *Psalms for All Seasons: A Complete Psalter for Worship*, will lead an annual series at Presbyterian churches in the New Jersey towns of Stockton, Lambertville, Titusville, and Mt. Airy in July. The 2012 Delaware Valley Summer Institute is free and open to the public.

The series, "Psalms for All Seasons: An Exploration of the Psalter as Teacher of Song and Prayer," will take place Sunday, July 8 through Wednesday, July 11 at the third Delaware Valley Summer Institute hosted by the Presbyterian churches in the four towns.

The July 8 presentation, hosted by the Stockton Presbyterian Church, will allow participants to explore the Psalter in Christian worship by taking a look at its use and development from ancient through modern times. The July 9 presentation, hosted by the First Presbyterian Church of Lambertville, will take participants on a journey through the Psalms as they have been used in churches in many cultures. The July 10 presentation, hosted by the First Presbyterian Church of Titusville, will enable participants to learn how to pray and sing the psalms in solidarity with others whose life experiences may be foreign to their own. The July 11 presentation, hosted by the Mt. Airy Presbyterian Church, will explore the New Testament's use of the Psalms, particularly as they gave voice to Christ and the church.

All presentations will begin at 7:00 p.m. and will be followed by light refreshments. Copies of *Psalms for All Seasons: A Complete Psalter for Worship* will be available for \$20 each evening or until supplies run out.
