God is praised for the history of faithfulness shown to God’s people. The congregation then joins the celestial choirs and all the faithful of every time and place to sing:

SUPPORT FARMERS AGAINST HUNGER - Come on out and support Farmers Against Hunger on Saturday, August 18 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. by attending the New Jersey Farmers Against Hunger Walk-A-Farm & Feast to fight Hunger event. It will take place at the Middlesex County EARTH Center's (home to Rutgers Cooperative Extension of Middlesex County). Participants will walk a course through the beautiful grounds and gardens located at Davidson's Mill Pond Park in South Brunswick and will experience educational, family-fun stations. There will be additional activities for participants to enjoy, including the Rutgers Master Gardeners display gardens as well as a wide array of vendors. A GREAT MISSION OPPORTUNITY! Wanted: an adventurous man or woman who is interested in driving a truck (not a huge one, and no license is required) to Maine to deliver toys and clothes and miscellaneous items to the residents, and to bring back wreaths to beautify the homes and surroundings in Monmouth and New Brunswick Presbyteries! The gentlemen who have been making this drive for many years feel unable to continue this valuable service. Discontinuing this trip would deprive Maine residents in need of some Christmas uplift of those clothes and toys mentioned earlier. It is suggested the driver leave here the Monday after Thanksgiving, November 26, and return the 29th or 30th. Arrangements would be made to have the truck ready to go, filled with the items useful to our friends in Maine. The trip is about 450 miles, and the driver could follow his/her own schedule, stop on the way (oh, yes, all driver's and partner's expenses are covered) deliver the items the next day, pick up the wreaths, find a motel that night, and come on back to NJ the next day. It is true that it is possible to FedEx the wreaths, but the missing ingredient is what we send up to Maine.

The willing person will be performing a genuine service to these friends in Maine who make the wreaths and who need the income they generate and also need what we send them. Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer: In Bangladesh we find a long-standing ministry of the Church of Bangladesh--the Rainbow Sewing Center. Through its 60 month training course, the center has touched the lives of nearly 2,000 women over the past 30 years. The Christian population in Bangladesh is only 0.3 percent which means that at the sewing center many students meet Christians for the first time. Six days a week young girls--single, married, widowed, or abandoned--gather for three hours of training and companionship. Friendships form among Hindus, Muslims, and Christians, lasting friendships as they receive a taste of the love of Christ. The students first learn to embroider and mend by hand. They then learn to sew a straight line, draw patterns for sari blouses and petticoats and soon are sewing frocks, trousers, and tunics. Then, armed with certificates graduates supplement their family incomes by sewing garments for neighbors or by working in nearby tailoring shops and garment factories. Over the years, women leaders in the Church of Bangladesh have nurtured this haven of peace and hope.
