**Skeet's Pantry NEWS:** Through your generosity, we are providing food for more families than ever. Here are the numbers to prove how much you are doing for the community:

In the first 8 months of 2011, we served 356 families, consisting of 1,037 people.

In the first 8 months of 2012, we served 529 families, consisting of 1,564 people.

**Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer:** Church of the Pilgrims in Washington, DC is known for its ministries of local justice and outreach, particularly to the poor and homeless. One of their long term mission projects is the Pilgrimage which is set up like a hostel. The Pilgrimage welcomes groups of up to 40 people and puts people into contact with poor and low-income residents of the city. Pilgrimage groups work in soup kitchens, food banks, urban gardens and homeless shelters. Through this hands-on work, the groups learn about the realities of being poor and hungry and that justice must be experienced and must be lived out by a way of life. Pilgrimage participants integrate their experience with their faith and knowledge inspired, it is hoped, to live out the call of the prophet Isaiah to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God. Stories are exchanged at the Pilgrimage, as well as gifts and

experiences with those who are hungry and oppressed and it is also a place where those present learn how to shape public policy.

**Cranbury Women's Bible Study - Calling Women Of All Ages And Stages!** There's no better way to grow in your relationship with God than by getting into His Word. You are invited to come check out the Cranbury Women's Bible Study led by Elyse Casimir.

This year, we will be looking at the Old Testament; the book we will use is "Cookies on the Lower Shelf" Part 1 (Genesis-Ruth). This study provides a step-by-step guide beginning with God's beautiful creation in Genesis to the rabble-rousing days of the Judges of Israel. Meet Adam and Eve, weather the flood with Noah, and sojourn with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. Go from the land of Canaan into Egypt with Joseph, then back out again as Moses and the children of Israel travel to the Promised Land. See tremendous victories under Joshua and chilling defeats during the time of the Judges. The format of this study is designed to flex with the needs of each student. That means it will work for you if this is your first or your twentieth Bible study, or if you have a lot of time during the week to dig into the Bible or very little.

The Cranbury Women's Bible Study is also a great place to connect with other women in our community and support and encourage one another in our walk with the Lord. To accommodate a variety of schedules, this study will be run in two groups each meeting every other week on Mondays.

For those home during the day, the group will meet from 9:30 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. in Room 10 of our church. This group begins October 1. For those who need a study at night, there will be a group that meets from 7:30 p.m. - 9:00 p.m. at Roselynn Cassidy's home. This group begins September 24.

Elyse has been leading this group for nearly 10 years. She has taught Sunday School worked with youth both at home and abroad has worked with Women's groups and along with her husband have mentored married and engaged couples. Elyse also led our Adult Spring Retreat this year. She loves the Lord, is passionate about digging into God's Word, has a warm compassionate heart, and is very interested in every woman knowing God and His Word for herself.

~~ PEACEMAKING OFFERING ~~

The Presbyterian Peacemaking Offering supports the efforts of Presbyterians through their congregations, presbyteries, synods, and the General Assembly to work for peace by tearing down the walls of hostility. The day recommended for congregations to receive the Offering is **World Communion Sunday, October 7**, which is a celebration of the unity of the worldwide church through Christ. Christians in congregations around the world participate in the Lord's Supper.
