### ~~ MISSION, SERVICE & GRANTS ~~

**Welcome Distinguished Congo Church Leader today, Sept. 23**

Through our church's involvement in the work of the IMCK/ Good Shepherd Hospital as well as other mission projects in the Kasai region of the Congo, we were invited recently to be one of the host churches for a special visitor from the Congo in September. That visitor is Dr. Joseph Mulumba Musumbu Mukundi, Secretary General of the Presbyterian Church in the Congo. Dr. Mulumba will in the United States this fall to both keynote the conference of the Presbyterian Church-USA Congo Mission Network Conference in Delaware, and to also visit with Presbyterian congregations in several states to discuss with them mission and church efforts in his country. Today, we welcome Dr. Mulumba to our church.

The Presbyterian Church in Congo which is led by Dr. Mulumba has about 2 MILLION members, 1,500 churches, over 830 primary and secondary schools, various training schools, a seminary, a number of hospitals and many medical clinics. All of this is happening in the midst of ongoing military and rebel actions producing maiming injuries, assaults on women, kidnapping and famine. Electricity is unreliable, plumbing is often non-existent, and equipment to properly provide medical care is scarce.

The support our church has provided to our sisters and brothers in the Congo has been possible through both grants from our church and funds raised at our annual Mission Fair. This year, the Fair will take place on Sunday, November 11 from 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., featuring representatives from many local service organizations as well as a Jewelry-Handbag flea market and bake sale for the Good Shepherd Hospital. Preaching on the morning of the Fair at 10:30 a.m. will be Dr. Elsie McKee, well-known Princeton Seminary Professor who grew up in the Congo.

Congregation members will be interested to know that Dr. Mulumba also serves on the Board of IMCK/ Good Shepherd Hospital. His PhD in Theology is from Fuller Theological Seminary in California. He lives in Kanaga in the Kasai Province of the Congo with his wife Helene Kapinga. They have five children and two grandchildren.

In the first 8 months of 2012, we served 529 families, consisting of 1,564 people.

**Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer:** In 2007, Westminster Presbyterian in Minneapolis celebrated its 150th anniversary and nearby a Congregational Church also turned 150 that year. Westminster had conducted an anniversary campaign and committed 20 percent for local and global mission. The two churches formed a housing development with a local, affordable housing developer. The hope was to create 150 units of affordable supportive housing. The Housing 150's goal became to create Niccollet Square, 42 units of housing for vulnerable young people with services to support mental health, independent living, and employment skills. In December 2010 the first young people moved in. Members of both churches have donated many items and raised many volunteers. Businesses are hiring residents. The youth are learning how to tell their stories and advocate at the state legislature for programs that serve homeless and poor people.

**Cranbury Women's Bible Study - Calling Women of All Ages and Stages!** There's no better way to grow in your relationship with God than by getting into His Word. You are invited to come check out the Cranbury Women's Bible Study led by Elyse Casimir.

This year, we will be looking at the Old Testament; the book we will use is "Cookies on the Lower Shelf" Part 1 (Genesis-Ruth). This study provides a step-by-step guide beginning with God's beautiful creation in Genesis to the rabble-rousing days of the Judges of Israel. Meet Adam and Eve, weather the flood with Noah, and sojourn with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. Go from the land of Canaan into Egypt with Joseph, then back out again as Moses and the children of Israel travel to the Promised Land. See tremendous victories under Joshua and chilling defeats during the time of the Judges. The format of this study is designed to flex with the needs of each student. That means it will work for you if this is your first or your twentieth Bible study, or if you have a lot of time during the week to dig into the Bible or very little.

The Cranbury Women's Bible Study is also a great place to connect with other women in our community and support and encourage one another in our walk with the Lord. To accommodate a variety of schedules, this study will be run in two groups each meeting every other week on Mondays.

For those home during the day, the group will meet from 9:30 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. in Room 10 of our church. This group begins October 1. For those who need a study at night, there will be a group that meets from 7:30 p.m. - 9:00 p.m. at Rosellyn Cassidy's home. This group begins September 24.

Elyse has been leading this group for nearly 10 years. She has taught Sunday School worked with youth both at home and abroad has worked with Women's groups and along with her husband have mentored married and engaged couples. Elyse also led our Adult Spring Retreat this year. She loves the Lord, is passionate about digging into God's Word, has a warm compassionate heart, and is very interested in every woman knowing God and His Word for herself.
