God is praised for the history of faithfulness shown to God’s people. The congregation then joins the celestial choirs and all the faithful of every time and place to sing:

The prayer continues with thanksgiving for the life and work of Jesus Christ. The Words of Institution are recalled. The elements are set apart for their sacred use, and we offer ourselves to God’s service. Then, this response:

The presence of the Holy Spirit is sought, as well as God’s blessing on our lives. The prayer concludes with a Trinitarian doxology.

Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer: The Presbytery of Genesee Valley became interested in and concerned about Sudan after they had welcomed Sudanese refugee families at the Rochester airport. These Sudanese revisited their former home and returned to the States with sad hearts for they found that lack of clean drinking water had left people sick, schools and medical facilities had been destroyed. A program "Water for Sudan" was founded seven years ago and since then 88 wells have been drilled in remote arid villages in southern Sudan. Four years ago, "Building Minds for Sudan" was founded and now schools are being built thus rebuilding hope in Sudan. But not content with only material need assistance, the Presbytery was inspired to "Pray for Peace." In response, the Presbytery sponsored a candlelight prayer vigil on Epiphany in 2011 lifting up Sudan on the cusp of the birth of a new nation. May God bless and grant peace to the people of Sudan and South Sudan.
