Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer: The Saskatoon Native Circle Ministry (SNCM) in Canada is a cheery spot providing a place where street people can drop in and feel at home, a place, according to the director, The Rev. Stewart Folster, where "we are like a family and take care of each other." Volunteers often make big pots of soup that bubble away on the stove. All afternoon the front door bell jangles and people seeking lunch and companionship arrive. They come to the counter and make their own sandwiches, warm up with soup and the strong hot coffee. Donuts, donated by a local donut shop provide dessert. One man remarked that this is his favorite place to come for lunch. "Nobody" he says "is looked down upon here; that's the beautiful part of it."
