Today we look to Chile and the Evangelical Presbyterian Church. As Christians in the Reformed tradition, they give thanks to the indigenous people who have taught them to respect the earth as a mother who engenders life. And they are asked, as followers of Jesus, to live humbly as an integral part of creation. Our Chilean brothers and sisters are called to challenge those who seek to exploit their nation's water and mineral wealth for unsustainable, short-term gain leading to long-term poverty, hunger, and thirst. Do we have a similar attitude?

Bread for the World

According to an item in the something to alleviate these sad conditions, is to participate on April 28 in sending out letters to our President, our Senators and Representatives, asking them to take leading roles in ending hunger in this world.

Star Ledger quoting the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities "the war on poverty half-won. The US poverty rate would have been nearly twice as high in 2011 without a safety net. 16% Counting Social Security and all other government assistance (after taxes). 29% Counting no government assistance (before taxes)". News like this makes us realize how important it is that we contact our government officials, urging them to continue the current programs that offer assistance to people in need and, if possible, to add to them. Some of the goals we should try to attain are: 1. Ensure that all jobs pay enough so that no full-time worker has to support a family in poverty. 2. Strengthen

nutrition and other anti-poverty programs so that if a family suffers a sharp drop in income due to a job loss illness or other emergency none of the family members is put at risk of hunger.

3. Invest in human development through education and skills for jobs the country needs to fill now and in the future. Let's all be on hand April 28 to send off those letters urging our Senators and Representatives to give serious thought to make a priority the ending of hunger.
