<u>Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer:</u> We've spoken of One Great Hour of Sharing and the wonderful things it causes to happen, and this morning we travel to Belize to hear about the Sandy Beach Women's Cooperative in Hopkins Village. Three years ago 28 economically poor women started this cooperative, and three

years later they opened a small hotel with two small cabanas and a restaurant. They worked hard, reinvested their money, and added three more cabanas. And they were able to care for their families. But disaster struck in May 2005 with a fire destroying the thatch buildings, and leaving standing only two cabanas. But not to give up, the women began to cook meals in their homes for both tourists and local people and again they reinvested their profits and they eventually were able to rebuild the restaurant. But disaster struck again and destroyed nearly all their buildings. But this time OGHS was there to help through the Presbyterian Committee on the Self-Development of People which made a grant of \$20,038 to the Sand Beach Women to rebuild their restaurant. The women will once again be able to support their families and to generate profits that will be used slowly but surely to rebuild the hotel. So, once again, we can rejoice that money we have contributed to One Great House of Sharing has been such a wonderful help to a group of striving
