**Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer:** Baltimore Presbytery has a novel, but productive program emerging from its mission partner, The Center. The Center encourages local and out-of-town groups to do something about injustices in our world. Groups are invited to spend a day, weekend or week addressing issues of poverty, inadequate housing, or environmental pollution in the neighborhoods of Baltimore. The groups are partnered with local congregations and spend their time learning, thinking about, and doing justice work. They learn the work of social justice through the lens of our faith. They then devise the faithful congregation worshiped with wind whipping through broken windows and doors a plan to effect change in their own communities. Among the Center's partnering faith groups one congregation is planning a campaign to clean up local streams and waterways, another is expanding its ability to feed the hungry in its community, and a third is exploring ways fully to engage its diverse and changing neighborhood. All are working with the Center to meet the challenge to be apostles of reconciliation in their communities.
