The Board of Brainerd/ Westminster Cemetery is very happy to announce that work on the Revolutionary War Soldiers & Brainerd Cemetery Information Site, next to our church office/ across from the Cranbury Inn, has been completed. Two new granite benches at the site are gifts from Doug Sutphen, proprietor of A.L. Duryee & Son Monuments in Hightstown. The sign at the site, depicting our church and cemetery history, is a gift in memory of Anna and Walter Wahler. In addition, new brick walkways have also been installed.

This site improvement work has been part of the ongoing Brainerd/ Westminster Cemetery preservation program which was begun in 2009. The Board hopes congregation members and visitors to our town will enjoy these improvements and find the history of the cemetery a fascinating trip into our past.

Mission of the Month: NAMI Mercer

NAMI support and education services are a direct response to the expressed needs of individuals and family members for support and information needed to manage recovery from mental illness. The combination of both support on an ongoing basis and education beginning early in the onset of mental illness, provides the optimum assistance to both families and consumers to manage the long-term illness and recovery processes. In addition, the educational outreach in the general community assists individuals and families in combating stigma and in identifying mental illness early so that early intervention is possible.

People who are affected by mental illness as caregivers, family members, friends or consumers, are welcomed to participate in NAMI Mercer programs. This includes people from all socio-economic and racial-ethnic groups. NAMI Mercer serves people from the greater Mercer County area, including Cranbury. NAMI Mercer holds many meetings throughout the county to provide our support and education to a diverse group of people in need.

Karen Marquis, President of NAMI Mercer will present the Minute for Mission on Sunday and be available during coffee hour to discuss the many programs that are available in their offices. Among them are support and education programs for children, young adults, adults and family members. Please come and hear what they have to offer.

Snippets from The Year Book of Prayer: It is interesting to know what one of our neighboring presbyteries is doing for youth. Several churches in the Presbytery of Long Island, NY, minister to young males through the W.A.N.T.E.D. The question was "What do we most want our sons, even the perpetrators of crime to know about themselves?" The answer was, "We want them to know they are wanted". So, instead of telling the young men of the world that they are "wanted" in a negative sense, the W.A.N.T.E.D. Project tells young men instead that they are worthy, accountable, named, thankful, empowered and determined. It has taken the future of young males to heart and is addressing the issues that plague many young men between the ages of 12 and 18. Fifteen young men were in the first class which met for a seven-week program, learning what it means to be wanted in positive terms. The program continues with monthly meetings to support the young men. Parents who hear about the program almost always respond "Thank God! When can they start?" The congregations in the partnership are grateful to answer God's call and serve their community in a loving and caring way.
