Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. MISSION, SERVICE & GRANTS

Snippets from The Year Book of Prayer: All of us are, I trust, aware that our church has a primary mission interest in the Congo. In the Congo, much knowledge is learned orally. So, whenever anything important is said children will often punctuate the information with "Kupa moyo to!" (don't forget). In the Congo, as in most of the world, seeds from the harvest are saved to plant the next season. The children are taught by a visiting Presbyterian Hunger Program coordinator the imperatives of saving seeds. First, store the seeds where the animals won't get them – "don't forget". Second, if you have to leave in a hurry, grab the seeds – "don't forget!" The last instruction is heart wrenching. No child in this world of overproduction and overconsumption should have to go hungry in order to eat next season. During World Food Day which was October 16, but could be considered to be every day, we should all remember to "kupa moyo to" – "don't forget" - children throughout the world, including the United States, who do not have enough to eat. What are we doing to ensure that the vulnerable among us do not go hungry!
