MISSION, SERVICE & GRANTS

Snippets from The Year Book of Prayer: Few of us, I would guess, are familiar with the country of Lithuania. But, thanks to Presbyterian mission workers, some interesting work is taking place there through visits to what is termed a "deserted place," a large men's prison in the deep Lithuanian forests. The place is called by a Russian name meaning "those who were blamed." One young man whom the couple tutor wrote "I thought a lot about you. You spend so much time, effort, and money to make my life better, even not knowing me. You never asked why I am here. It seems that I matter to you. (You think) I am worth it." Here in a deserted place, one is full of fear, far from the things needed. What a blessing that there is help for these prisoners, helped given by missionaries our church supports.

Mission Dinner Fundraiser: (Formerly Guatemala Dinner): Our mission dinner is quickly approaching. Don't miss the wonderful opportunity for church fellowship, entertainment and a delicious meal. There are a limited number of tickets being sold, so buy them today.
