## **MISSION, SERVICE & GRANTS**

**Snippets from The Year Book of Prayer:** Central Florida Presbytery supports, among other causes, The Society of St. Andrew, a national gleaning organization which provides congregations with the opportunity to participate in direct hunger relief by gleaning fresh produce that is distributed to food banks and shelters in the community. In 2006, the presbytery and St. Andrews launched their first annual Presbyterians' Day in the Grove. Approximately 90 youth and chaperones gleaned

more than 20,000 pounds of citrus! In 2007, members of the homeless community began to participate in the event, volunteering alongside members of local congregations. The Day in the Grove has become so popular that by 2011 it had grown to over 350 volunteers and the 350 volunteers split into two groves and gleaned 42,000 pounds of citrus for the hungry.
