### MISSION, SERVICE & GRANTS

**Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer:** Sri Lanka, like so many other places in the world, including the United States, is faced with the government's recovery strategy and protecting the fragile lagoons where fisher folks live and work. Tourism which means hotel and resort establishment is under way, and the fishing families' lives continue to be disrupted. The water they rely on for food is sold off or leased to entertain paying tourists. The chair of the Presbyterian Hunger Program is a long time human rights activist. He insists, "I will continue my engagements to make Sri Lanka a democratic and decent society."

**September Wish List for Skeet's Pantry:** We are collecting Laundry Detergent (regular size – not giant size, please) so that we can give one container to each family at our October Food Pantry – that will be on October 17.

The "new normal" for our pantry seems to be at least 80+ families, compared to the 50 to 60 families we used to expect just a few years ago. In August we gave bags of groceries and fresh produce to 83 families, totaling 262 people of all ages in those families. So needless to say, your generous help continues to be deeply appreciated!
