<u>June Wish-List for Skeet's Pantry</u>: For June, we are hoping for the following foods:

- CEREAL Especially varieties without lots of extra sugar
- PASTA any and all kinds

We always welcome any and all good food, as long as the expiration date hasn't been reached yet. If you have "odd items" of food which you're not sure people might like, we do have a miscellaneous table each month from which our families can select items which we don't have in enough quantity to put in every bag. But again, please double check that the expiration date is still current.

Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer: Founded in 1989 by several congregations from the Presbytery of Carlisle in PA, Lend-A-Hand has carried out its mission as a local disaster response and assistance program. It coordinates all the details for frequent presbytery-wide mission trips to help people suffering extraordinary hardship as the result of natural disasters. The all-volunteer organization concentrates on helping people who are elderly or who live with handicaps or on small incomes. In addition to work in the region, over the last few years, teams have traveled to the South, the Midwest and many other places to repair damage from floods, tornados, hurricanes, fires and blizzards. While Lend-A-Hand works to repair damaged homes, one of the most valuable things its volunteers do is listen. Relationship building is central to its mission.

Can We Abolish Poverty?: In early April, the faith leaders partnering with the World Bank in a renewed commitment to end extreme poverty by 2030 issued a statement: "Ending Extreme Poverty: A Moral and Spiritual Imperative". As Christians in the Cranbury Presbyterian Church, surely we share the belief that the moral test of our society is how the weakest and most vulnerable are faring. Our Bible calls us to combat injustice and uplift the poorest in our midst.

This goal for abolishing poverty and hunger builds on progress that has already been made against poverty. Since 1990, the number of people living in extreme poverty (on \$1.25 a day) has been halved to less than one billion. Data and increasing evidence demonstrate that, for the first time in human history the world can bring an end to extreme poverty within a generation. It's never been possible in any other generation. Ours is the generation to do it. Let us, in our prayers and attitudes, join in this great effort. (Material taken from Bread for the World newsletter)Gretchen Stults
