MESSAGE FROM THE CHILDREN'S CHOIR

Today we are going to sing the American Negro Spiritual, "Down by the Riverside" also known as, "Study War No More." This song originated with the slaves in the South who sang it as a work song before the American Civil War freed them all from slavery.

Slaves were the property of their owners. Most of them weren't allowed to read or write. They couldn't vote or fight for freedom like the people who protect us today by serving in our military.

One of the only ways slaves could find freedom or peace was to sing songs that reminded them that God and Jesus Christ would one day take them all to freedom, even though for some of them it might only be in Heaven.

Spirituals are easy to remember. They have nice melodies and some have a lot of verses. Singing spirituals helps us to remember that no matter how hard life can be sometimes, God is always with us.

Donations are also accepted to be used to purchase turkeys, fresh fruit and vegetables. Checks should be made out to the Board of Deacons earmarked "Thanksgiving Baskets" which can be placed in the collection baskets during worship. Thank you very much in advance!
