MISSION, SERVICE & GRANTS

An Inspiring story: 15,000 sheets of tin, 5,000 pounds of roofing nails and 1,700 sacks of cement---what is the story behind these items? These items are being used to build 500 homes in Haiti. This material has been paid for by people and organizations like ours who contributed to the Friends for Health, a clinic in Haiti. The clinic personnel visited the homes in 20 communities. 500 homes were chosen for Stage I of the building process which would involve communities that are in the closest proximity to the clinic in Gattineau. If the house was destroyed or severely damaged and the homeowner owned the land on which the house stood, he or she would be offered 30 sheets of tin (for the roof) roofing nails and 4 sacks of cement to rebuild his/her house. Stage II of the building project will involve communities that are further up the mountain from the clinic. Much the same procedure will be followed, and more homes will be built!

After four months, people are beginning to feel safe, dry and secure living, as they are, under the new, shiny tin roofs glimmering in the sunlight. Does it make your heart warm a bit to know that money from our Mission Grant Fund has helped to provide these new homes for many Haitians?
