Do We Know Your Story Yet?

A few days ago, you should have received the link to your CAT. If you haven't already, please set aside 30 minutes to complete the assessment. Your PERSONAL STORY is critical to our leaders as they plan for our future. PLEASE MAKE THIS A PRIORITY THIS WEEK if you haven't already shared your experiences and perspectives by participating in this important process.

- Online users should have received an email from the church with instructions from the Transition Team, explaining how to use The Church Assessment Tool's (CAT) unique link to the CAT Survey. To complete the online survey all you have to do is click on the link to start your survey.
- Paper copies are available for those of you without access to a computer, or who prefer to fill out a paper copy of the CAT Survey. There is a letter from the church with instructions explaining how to use The Church Assessment Tool (CAT) attached to your paper copy. The paper surveys are now available in the Narthex, Fellowship Hall, the library and the church office.
- If, after reading the instructions, you still have questions about the survey, a Transition Team member will be available during coffee hours the next few weeks to answer your questions.
- The CAT survey takes approximately 30 minutes to complete. Once finished, completed paper surveys can be dropped off in the *Completed Paper Survey Boxes* located in the Narthex, Fellowship Hall, library and church office.
- Reminder, the online survey will not allow you to submit your responses unless all questions are answered. For open-ended questions, if you have no comments, respond by typing "NA". Online users don't forget to press SUBMIT once you have completed your survey!
